


LOCATION

Puerto Rico is a territory of the United States. It is a tropical island located about 1,000 miles southeast of Florida. Most of the island is surrounded by the Caribbean Sea. The Atlantic Ocean is on the northern coast. San Juan, the capital, is located on the northern coast. Puerto Rico is part of a larger chain of islands in the Caribbean. Haiti and the Dominican Republic share an island located west of Puerto Rico. The British Virgin Islands stretch out to the east. Mona Island in the far west also belongs to Puerto Rico. Viegues and Culebra are islands off the eastern short of the main island. Puerto Rico means "rich port" in Spanish.



LAND

Puerto Rico is full of lush greenery and turquoise waters. 🧎 Mountains are located in the middle of the island. The tall peaks of the Cordillera Central stretch from east to west. El Yunque is a rain forest that shades the mountainsides of northeastern Puerto Rico. Crops are grown in the fertile valleys. Rain falls in short bursts on the northern mountains of the slopes. Most rivers flow into the Atlantic Ocean. Caves and other limestone formations are northwest of the mountains. There are plains that line the northern and southern coasts of Puerto Rico. Sandy beaches surround the island. It is warm year-round on the island. Hurricanes and earthquakes are common.

HISTORY

The Taino people lived on the island that became Puerto Rico long before Europeans arrived. They called their island Boringuen, or "Land of the Mighty" Lord." Christopher Columbus arrived in 1493 with seventeen ships. He claimed the island for Spain. The Spanish began to settle Puerto Rico in 1508. They brought disease, slavery, and war to the island. Puerto Rico remained under Spanish rule for over 400 years. The United States gained control of Puerto Rico in 1898 after the

Spanish-American War. Puerto Ricans were granted U.S. citizenship in 1917. Puerto Rico became a commonwealth in 1952. This meant it would govern itself, but still be tied to the United States. In 2012, Puerto Ricans voted in favor of becoming a U.S. State. This has not happened yet though.

NATURE

Bats, mongooses, iguanas, and other lizards live in Puerto Rico. The national animal of Puerto Rico is the coqui, a tiny frog. Puerto Ricans take pride in the *Paso Fino*, of "fine step," horses bred on the island. There are hundreds of species of birds in Puerto Rico including woodpeckers, screech owls, and Puerto Rican parrots. The national bird is the stripe-headed tanager. The Flor de Maga is the national flower.

LANDMARKS

The Castillo San Felipe del Morro is a fort that was built in the 1500s to protect San Juan. Visitors can still see the cannons that once fired across the bay. The Capilla del Santa Cristo de la Salud is a chapel that was built between 1753 and 1780. Legend says it was erected to honor a miracle. The Museum of the Americas and the San Juan Cathedral are popular sites. Rio Camuy Cave Park features trails through one of the world's largest cave systems. The caves were carved underground over the course of millions of years. The Arecibo Observatory has one of the world's largest telescopes. The Ponce Museum of Art has the largest collection of art in the Caribbean.

PEOPLE


Most people work in service jobs at places like hotels, shops, restaurants, banks, schools, and hospitals. Farmers harvest coffee, tobacco, sugar cane,

and tropical fruits. Cows, pigs, and chickens are also raised by many Puerto Ricans. Some people catch snappers and lobsters with nets. The national sport of Puerto Rico is baseball. Puerto Rico native Roberto Clemente is remembered as one of the greatest baseball players of all time. Many players on U.S. teams come from the island. Basketball, boxing, and horse racing are other popular sports. The environment is perfect for swimming, surfing, snorkeling, and scuba diving. People also hike,

camp, and bird-watch. Puerto Rican food is a blend of Spanish, Taino, African, and American tastes. Soups and stews are popular. *Asopao* is a thick soup made with chicken or seafood. *Carne guisada* is a traditional beef soup. *Lechon asado*, or roasted pig, is popular at special occasions. Plantains are often eaten as a side.

FLAG

The flag of Puerto Rico has five alternating bands of red and white. A blue triangle with a white star in the center is on the left side. The star represents Puerto Rico. The triangle and stripes stand for the Puerto Rican government and the freedom of its people. The Cuban flag inspired the flag. Puerto Rico's flag was adopted in 1952.


