




Day 1:

AAPI HERITAGE MONTH

Asian American Pacific Islander (AAPI) Heritage Month was established in 1990 in the United States to recognize the history, cultures, and contributions of Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders. It celebrates Americans who are from Asia and the Pacific Islands or whose families are originally from Asia and the Pacific Islands.



Asia is the largest continent and includes 48 countries. The Pacific Islands include 20,000 islands. Some islands are a part of Asia, and some are a part of other continents, like North America and Australia.

The United States has a long history of people immigrating from many parts of Asia. AAPI Heritage Month is celebrated in May to remember the arrival of the first Japanese immigrants to the United States on May 7, 1843. The month of May was also selected to honor the contributions that Chinese American immigrants made to the Transcontinental Railroad, which was completed on May 10, 1869.

Did you know... Asian Pacific American Heritage Month was originally a one-week celebration? In 1978, President Jimmy Carter passed a law which made it an annual celebration. In 1990, AAPI Heritage Month was extended to the entire month of May.




