
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Directions for Teachers:





There were 8 sheep at Ali's farm. Ali sold 4 sheep to Omar for Eid. How many sheep did Ali have left?


Mr. Raki had 6 sheep on his farm. He sold 2 sheep to Mr. Zahir for Eid. How many sheep did Mr. Raki have left?





Eid al Adha Center #5: Story of Sacrifice


Read the story and answer the questions.
